Job Description	<p>Seasonal Interpretive Park Ranger Position - Cape Cod Canal, MA The Cape Cod Canal, owned and operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers, is one of the Corps' busiest projects, with annual visitation of more than 3 million visitors. In order to manage heavy summer visitation, a seasonal Ranger staff is needed to assist the permanent Park Ranger staff. The Cape Cod Canal is a shining example of the unique blend of natural and engineered environs found at many US Army Corps of Engineers projects. The Corps' missions at the Canal vary from safe navigation to recreation to stewardship of environmental and cultural resources. Park Rangers at the Cape Cod Canal offer a comprehensive interpretive program that represents this diversity. Seasonal Park Rangers will participate in the various aspects within the programs offered. They include: Outreach Program: During May and June all seasonal Park Rangers will be required to assist with the Canal's student outreach program. This includes leading tours, activities and games through the Cape Cod Canal Visitor Center about the Canal's marine operations, unique features and history. Students are primarily 3rd and 4th graders. Visitor Center: Interpretive Rangers will be required to staff the Canal's Visitor Center in Sandwich. The visitor center receives approximately 35,000 visits a year. Duties for this assignment include operating the Center's bookstore, providing information regarding the center's exhibits, leading interpretive programs within the visitor center, operating audiovisual and computer equipment, answering questions, assisting lead Park Rangers with exhibit development, and light maintenance and cleaning. Scheduled Programs: Throughout the summer, Park Rangers offer daily interpretive programs including guided walks, evening programs, bike hikes, beach explorations and a Junior Ranger program. Summer Interpretive Rangers will be tasked lead or assist with some of these programs and may be required to develop original program content and activities. Static Displays: Develop/install wayside exhibits, signs, display case content at various points along the Canal. Advertisement: Setting up bulletin boards, preparing and sending out mailers and preparing updates to be posted on our website to keep the public informed. Maintenance: Help maintain various recreation areas and trails along the Cape Cod Canal. Work may include, but is not limited to, policing litter, recycling, landscaping, trail maintenance and/or sign</p>

installation. Work may involve use of power equipment Visitor Assistance: Inform public of rules and regulations. Respond to incidents and accidents as trained, and complete incident reports as required. Training: Seasonal hires will receive interpretive and visitor management training as well as first responder and CPR and AED certification. Salary: Salaries range from \$11.97 - \$16.40 per hour Requirements: To be eligible for this position, the applicant must be enrolled full or half-time for the upcoming fall semester in undergraduate or graduate level courses. Seasonal Rangers will be expected to work 40 hours a week with a rotating schedule including days, nights, weekends and holidays. Overtime may be required. Applicants should be able to communicate proficiently both verbally and in writing, have basic computer knowledge, be able to react appropriately during stressful situations, be neat in appearance, a team player and above all be courteous and respectful to the visiting public. All seasonal Rangers will be required to complete various on-line trainings including defensive driving. Additional requirements include: • U.S. citizenship • A valid driver's license • Minimum of one year of college level courses by start of work assignment • Background investigation • All federal employees are required to have federal salary payments made by direct deposit • A US Army Corps of Engineers uniform must be worn
