Under the direction of Conservation Program Coordinator, interns will assist in the development and implementation of conservation awareness programs for Northwest Trek Wildlife Park and its Conservation Center. Interns will be responsible for presenting conservation programs to the general public on a daily basis. Other duties may include conducting program evaluations, providing support to conservation crews, and wildlife monitoring activities both on and off Park property.

This internship is available spring, summer and fall. This program is open to college students or recently graduated students. Course work or practical experience in environmental education, interpretation, conservation, and/or wildlife biology is strongly recommended. An applicant for an internship must be at least 18 years of age and must be available to work weekdays and weekends. Interns must be available a minimum of 24 hours a week for 10 weeks, and are subject to a Washington State criminal background check.
