ENVIRONMENTAL HYDROGEOLOGY SPECIALIST

The Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Remediation and Waste Management, is seeking to fill an Environmental Hydrogeology Specialist vacancy in Augusta.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION: This position provides professional hydrogeologic services relating to the investigation, remediation, and monitoring of sites contaminated by a wide variety of petroleum and hazardous substances. The position specializes in soil investigation and remediation. Duties include review, oversight, participation in, and supervision of soil and hydrogeologic investigations and review of work plans and reports under the Brownfields, Voluntary Response Action, Uncontrolled Sites, and Superfund programs. The position will be expected to use a variety of sampling, geophysical and testing tools in the collection of soil, hydrological and geological data in field investigations. The position must be familiar with database, spreadsheet, GIS, statistical, geochemical, and data plotting software for interpretation and analysis of data in order to recommend, design, and evaluate remedial options. Strong verbal and writing skills are required for the presentation of conclusions to technical and non-technical audiences including Department staff, consultants, responsible parties and the general public.

Minimum Requirements: Candidates must have an 8-year combination of education and experience in the fields of hydrogeology, hydrology and geology, including experience in responsible charge of geological work.

Licensing/Registration/Certification Requirements: *(These must be met by all employees prior to attaining permanent status in this class).* Candidates must be certified as a Geologist by the Maine Board of Certification for Geologists and Soil Scientists.
